

Cooperation Highlights

1. Taiwan-Japan Collaboration Revives 13 Lost Millet Varieties

Through the USR project with [Kyoto Univ.](#), 13 lost millet seeds of Taiwan were recovered from Japan and replanted in accordance with Rukai agricultural traditions for regeneration.



2. Volunteer Engagement in Japan's Shikoku Region

NSYSU students volunteered across [Ehime Town](#), [Yawatahama City](#), and [Matsuyama City](#), for orange harvesting, beach cleanups, English/Mandarin exchanges, and tourism revitalization suggestions from a visitor's view.



3. Japan Summer Exchange Sparks Sustainability Innovation

NSYSU faculty led 10 students to [Chiba Univ.](#) and [Kanagawa Univ.](#) for exchanges on Global Sustainability Trends and Taiwan's Four Major Transformations - industrial, energy, lifestyle, and just transitions.



4. Banana Waste Transformed into Precious Japanese Washi Paper

[Ehime University](#) students and faculty visited NSYSU for community-based innovation projects, transforming agricultural banana waste into traditional Japanese washi paper.
